"Reasons, causes, and moral agents" is an invited speaker series to be held at the Universität Würzburg at various dates in 2022 and 2023. The guiding purpose of the series is, in short, to consider different approaches to the titular themes over a broad timeframe. This theme can be restated as: kinds of reasons and causes that are involved in making possible or bringing about our choices and activities, most specifically in the area of morality, though not exclusively.

Dr. Andreas Blank of Universität Klagenfurt achieved his doctorate at the Centre for Philosophy and Philosophy of Science at the University of Konstanz. He has since then also held visiting lecturer positions at both the Humboldt and the Free Universities of Berlin. Dr Blank has published on various aspects of historical philosophy, including early modern metaphysics and philosophy of science, early analytic philosophy, Wittgenstein, and neo-Kantian constructivism. Some recent works involve emergence in the early modern sciences, and early modern ethics and political philosophy. Dr Blank's talk for us here in Würzburg quite directly addresses the central themes of our speaker series. The talk will be held in English. We very much look forward to seeing you there.
